Broadleaf evergreen shrub with fragrant bell shaped white flowers, perfect for color in shady areas. Good for planting on slopes. *Ilex verticillata* Winter Red Winterberry Holly

Upright, oval shaped, female holly with leathery dark green leaves, white flowers, with a dazzling display of bright red berries. Works well in swampy conditions.

Upright broadleaf evergreen with large, bright showy pink flowers. Tolerates heavy shade.

Fast growing decidious shrub with yellow flowers and bright red foliage in fall. Excellent for stabilizing banks or slopes.

Size: #3 | Zone: 3 Mid - Late Summer

Fast growing green and purple grass with showy purple plumes in fall. Excellent drought tolerance and good for erosion control.

Carex appalachica Appalachian Sedge Grass



Size: #1 | Zone: 3 Mid Spring - Fall

Dwarf clumping grass with small spikes in spring that provides nectar to pollinators and seeds to birds in summer.

Carex laxiculmus

Bunny Blue Sedge Grass 'Hobb'



Size: #1 | Zone: 4 Mid Spring - Late Summer

Semi-evergreen, dwarf, blue-green grass, perfect for a pop of color in shady areas. Great as ground cover or in rain gardens.

Small, warm season bunch grass with eye catching pinkish-purple plumes in late summer, transitioning to brown in fall. Great for sandy soils and hot, dry locations.

Water loving, clumping, green grass with brown plumes in fall. Helps prevent soil erosions. Provides habitat for birds and small animals.

Compact statement grass with blue-green foliage in summer, transitioning to red, orange, and purple in fall. Tolerates clay soil, high heat and humidity. Seeds adored by many bird species. Excellent for erosion control. Great choice for rock and rain gardens.
